The children are working very hard in school and enjoying learning together in the classroom. Please do have a look at the Newsletter sent out last week detailing what your child has been learning this half term so that you can support them with this and maybe learn with them too!

Reading is high on our agenda in school. We aim for our pupils to develop a love of reading and experience the enjoyment and pleasure that comes from reading or sharing a good book, as well as a variety of other texts. Children are never too old to have a book read to them. Our Teachers are always modelling and encouraging this with children in school. Please support us in checking your child's planner and ensuring they are reading at home.

Some homework is being set on Teams to ensure that children are confident in using Teams as this is where Teachers will post work in the event of a bubble needing to close or an individual child isolating. Teachers are monitoring this to ensure that only the homework is posted. The children should not comment or post anything else to Teams.
