

PSHE - This half term we will be focusing on friendships and keeping safe.






Uniform - Thank you for ensuring your child has the correct school uniform - they look very smart. Now we are back after October, children should be in winter uniform.

Reading - Year 2 pupils should be reading for at least 15 minutes every day. When reading with your child, encourage them to sound out tricky words using their phonics and discuss any unfamiliar vocabulary with them. This would also be a great opportunity or you to discuss any areas which you and your child particularly enjoyed within a book. Regularly check their understanding, as this will support them with their learning. Some questions you could ask: what are the characters thinking/feeling? How do you know? Books will be changed regularly and the phonics book will be changed weekly on a Tuesday.

Join us as we head to the coldest places on the planet - the Arctic and Antarctic. Make sure you wrap up warm as we learn about the Polar Regions and the animals that survive there.


Frozen Planet!



Great explorers

In history, we will be introduced to Scott the Explorer and be thinking about why he is significant. We will discuss why we call him an explorer and why Antarctica might have been difficult to explore. We will then look at Captain Scott's diary and discuss what happened to him and his companions on his journey.





Polar Regions

In geography, we will be thinking about what geographical features we would see in Antarctica that we wouldn't see in our local area. We will begin by looking at the seven continents of the world. Next, we will identify the location of hot and cold areas in relation to the equator and North and South Poles. Finally, we will be researching a Polar animal.





Art

In art we will be looking at the contrast between the warm paint colours we used for our Great Fire of London pictures and the cold colours we would use to create a Polar scene. We will think about different tones and shades of colour and experiment with colour mixing. We will then be thinking about different textures to create a Polar collage, finishing by drawing a Polar animal to complete our artwork.

RE

This half term, we will consider how we can look after our planet. The ways in which religious and religious individuals and organisations show care and concern for the planet. The views and beliefs different religions will be discussed to develop an understanding of their views regarding the origins of the world. We will be taking time to reflect on the world in which we live and celebrate the wonderful things around us.
