Writing:

This term in Literacy our class book is 'Secrets of the Sun King' by Emma Carroll. For the first part of the term we will be using the historical events to write a newspaper report. For the later of the half term we will look at the features of a suspense-filled narrative story. We will then write our own Egyptian based suspense narratives.

Reading

As part of our guided reading we will be looking at extracts from the book 'Cogheart' by Peter Bunzl. Year 5 should continue to read at home and be encouraged to discuss what they have read and any interesting words they come across. As well children should read a wide range of authors and book types.

In Year 5 we are looking for book reviews to add to our reading corner and any book recommendation.



At the start of the term we completed our learning on line graphs, tables and timetables.

Our next topic will be multiplication and division where we will be focusing on these key mathematical terms: factors, multiples, common factors and prime, square and cube numbers. We will also be recapping and building on multiplication and division by 10, 100 and 1000. We will return to Multiplication and Division after the Christmas break where we will multiply and divide by increasingly larger numbers.

Our last topic before the Christmas break will be measure based focusing on perimeter and area.

Children are encouraged to show their working out when answering calculations involving larger number or multiple steps.



Our Science topic this term is 'Life Cycles'.

As part of the Year 5 curriculum we will learn about the differences between animal life cycles. We will also be able to describe the life process of some plants and animals.

Children will work scientifically by comparing the life cycle of different plants and animals within our environment. Children will also work scientifically through use of questioning to discuss and suggest why living things have differences and what advantages or disadvantages may be linked to their life cycle.
