This term we are focusing on the novel **Holes** by **Louis Sachar**. We will begin this by looking at a range of different openings together to see how they are similar/different before writing our own alternative opening to Holes. We will then look at how Louis Sachar weaves in setting description throughout and identify key words and phrases to use in our own setting description. After that, we will focus on how the author develops characters through action and dialogue.

To finish the term, and to coincide with Black History Month, we will be reading the Little People, Big Dream book about Martin Luther King Jr. We will pick out the key features and analyse the language used before creating a biography for Martin Luther King.

Key Vocabulary: figurative language, descriptive language, subordinate clauses, short sentences for impact, varied sentence structure, inverted commas, brackets, dashes, parenthesis, paragraphs, joined handwriting



Throughout Year 6, the children will be working on groups of objectives linked to the following blocks:

- Number and Place Value
- · Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division
 - Fractions and Decimals
 - Measurement
- Geometry (Shape and Space)
- · Statistics (Data Handling)_

This term, we will be learning about the place value of numbers up to 10 million. This unit of learning will include partitioning numbers, rounding numbers and negative numbers. To support your child with their learning, please encourage them to complete their weekly homework tasks and encourage your child to practise their times tables frequently. We want your child to be fluent so they can answer questions quickly and confidently.



PE - This term, our topic is athletics. Throughout the term, we will take part in activities based around the key events in athletics. PE will be on a Thursday and a Friday.

PSHE - In PSHE, we will be looking at health and wellbeing with a particular focus on mental health. We will think about how pupils can recognise and talk about their emotions, the benefits of physical exercise and simple self-care techniques, including the importance of rest, time spent with friends and family and the benefits of hobbies and interests.

Geography - In geogrpahy, we will be finding out what life is like in the Amazon. This will include thinking about the Amazon's climate and how the native animals are adapted to it
