*"We did lots of fun games and activities and at the end we had become **Anti Bullying Ambassadors!** During the day, we watched some videos including one about George, who helped raise money by running a mile – he had raised over £800,000 and is still going! It really inspired us.*

We were given some great ideas for activities we can do at school including one where we gave each other compliments – we wrote down a compliment for other people and thought we could bring this into school.
